- As of this date, 964 people have died in fire-related incidents across the United States in 2022, of which 77 died in New York State. While the causes of these fires have varied, the following are potential causes to focus on throughout the month.
- Lithium-ion Batteries: Multiple recent fires were reported to have been caused by issues involving lithium-ion batteries. Check out the informational pamphlet from NFPA to prevent these issues.

- Fair Play Ambulance Recovery Bill passed and Fire departments now eligible to bill for ambulance services effective July 8, 2022, and must do so within four years.
- Covid 19 newest variant BA2 spiked in April and May. 76% of Suffolk residents are fully vaccinated; 87% over 18 years of age. Suffolk county had 442,000 cases – of that 24,000 were hospitalized and 4389 have passed away since March 2020.
- Vital signs Conference is October 27-30 in Albany
- EMS Providers: CFR – 30; EMT-4388; CC-266; Paramedic 798 for a total of 5482.
- The Tom Lateulere EMS Conference was held April 30th in Selden and they had 55 students this year. Topics were Child Abuse, Cardiac Surgery, Pre-hospital trauma activation, Patient Assessment skills for trauma and medical patients and understanding your current state and local EMS policies.
