**On June 12, 2016 at approximately 2:00 A.M., a self-radicalized Homegrown Violent Extremist (H.V.E.) entered the Pulse Night Club in Orlando, FL and carried out a terror attack that killed 49 innocent victims.**

**The incident quickly transitioned from an active shooter event to a barricaded hostage taker. During the incident, the suspect professed his allegiance to ISIS and stated he had enough explosives to level “several blocks.”**

**This presentation will provide an in-depth overview of the Pulse Nightclub terror attack. Details will be conveyed regarding response, challenges faced and operational decisions made during the incident, including victim extraction. Chief Douglas Goerke will also share lessons learned from the event to assist first responders to better prepare for critical incidents involving active shooters and mass casualty incidents.**
